Course Title: Advanced Placement Statistics

Teacher's Name: Ms. Hillig

Textbook: **The Practice of Statistics, 5th Edition**
Starnes, Tabor, Yates, and Moore

Objective: The purpose of the Advanced Placement course in Statistics is to introduce students to the major concepts and tools for collecting, analyzing and drawing conclusions from data. Students are exposed to four broad conceptual themes: Exploring Data: Describing patterns and departures from patterns. Sampling and Experimentation: Planning and conducting a study. Anticipating Patterns: Exploring random phenomena using probability and simulation. Statistical Inference: Estimating population parameters and testing hypotheses.

Key Goals: The key goals of this course are to provide the scope and level of academic rigor and accomplishment in a college introductory statistics course. To make sure all students are well prepared to take the AP Statistics Exam in May 2019 scoring well enough to receive college credit.

AP Exam: All Students are expected to take the AP Statistics Exam given on May 16, 2019. The fee for the exam is \$94.00 (<https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/takingtheexam/exam-fees>)

Necessary Materials: Each student needs to bring to class pens/pencils, a 5 subject notebook **dedicated just for Math**, a folder, and a graphing calculator every day. Students will be asked to purchase an AP Review Book at some point during the course.

Homework Assignments: Homework will be assigned each night. The student's name and the assignment should be visible at the top of the page. Homework is to be done neatly. Homework will be check each day. To be a successful student in this class it is extremely important that homework is done nightly. **Late homework will not be accepted.** If a student is absent they can check the class web site for the assignment. Homework can be turned in when they return.

Textbook: Students are required to bring their textbook to class **everyday**.

Calculation of Grade:

- 50% - Tests
- 25% - Quizzes/Projects
- 20% - Homework
- 5% - Participation/Preparedness

Testing: If a student misses an exam, it is his/her responsibility to see me regarding a time and place to schedule a make-up exam. If a student does not make up a missed test that test will receive a grade of zero. Since every student is required to have a calculator, sharing a calculator during an exam is not permitted. Similarly, students are responsible to have their calculators with them on testing days, no excuses! If a student does not have a calculator on a test day then the student will have to take the exam without a calculator.

Classroom Policies:

- Every student is expected to come to class on time. After 3 lates a student will serve detention with the teacher.
- Each student is expected to come to class prepared to work with the necessary materials each day.

Classroom Web Site: I have set up a web site for the class. The web address for this web site is www.mshillig.org. It will contain homework assignments, resources and important documents. It is updated on a daily basis.

Home Logic: Home Logic will be updated on a weekly basis. I would ask that you give me a week to grade any tests, quizzes, or projects. It is extremely important that you check home logic on a weekly basis. If you have any concerns they can be addressed right away. If you have any concerns regarding the system or are having trouble please do not hesitate to ask.

Remind App: Throughout the year I will be using this app to remind students of certain things. For example: upcoming tests, quizzes, projects, extra credit, etc. Students are **required** to register for this application either by downloading the free app on their smart phone or by going to www.remind.com and click on sign up. Parents/Guardians may also register and receive the same messages I send to students. Just ask your child for the class code.

Contact: I will be using the student's school email account to communicate with them. I am asking for a parent email address so that I can contact you by email as well. I would like to have the opportunity to use email as well as the telephone. Please print your email address on the next page and check whether you check your email regularly. **Please Note:** if you have the letter O in your email address write it as an O if you have a zero in your email address put a diagonal line through the zero. If you have the letter L in your email please write it like L and if you have the number 1 in your email please write it like 1.
